I believe this is wrong, even though it may be supported by some paperwork, the paperwork does not state that it was the only fifty cards issued.

I have had three of these cards over a time and still have one used card. The serial number on that card is 28910011, a far cry from the numbers listed in Mr Allen's letter from Vietnam. This would indicate at least a range from 28910011 through to 28912149. being some 2,100 cards.

From my studies of the overseas tenerics, particularly in the 289 prefix, I have not the following from cards that I have actually seem when trying to build a history of the various principles

My opinion re the rarest card would not be to include the 600 run cards as they are not fire different or from a different reprint, likewise of the Anritsu. It was not an issued card for use in phones, being a specimen card.

What does this leave maybe the two rarest different cards as issued (arthout looking at prefix runs or specimens) would be the \$50 Vietnam or the \$100 Cambodia (Laward, Open for comments, praise or criticism.






Figure 3 Courtesy of the Phonecard Museum
